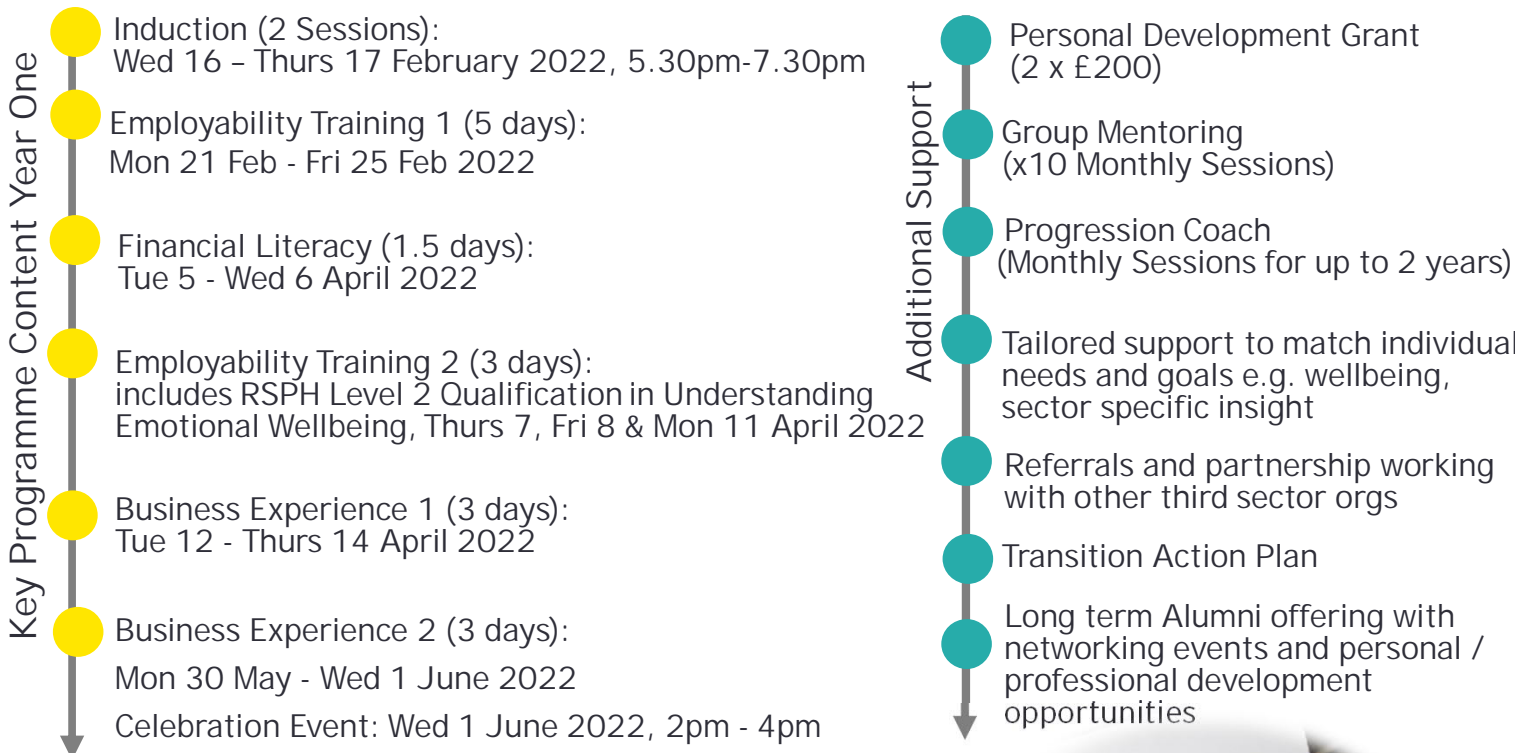

Who are EY Foundation

EY Foundation is a charity that equips young people with the skills, experience and knowledge to make a successful transition into work. Established by EY, the global professional services firm, since 2014 we have worked with over 7000 young people, 6000 volunteers, 300 employers and 300 entrepreneurs.

We operate nationally and cover over 17 locations in England and Scotland and have a hub in Birmingham.

Who is the programme for?

Young people:

- ✓ Aged 16-18
- ✓ In part / full time education (any setting and no academic requirements) and likely to be until end June 2022)
- ✓ In care
- ✓ With right to work in UK (original documents need to be verified)
- ✓ With National Insurance Number
- ✓ Willing to commit to a one year programme (20.5 days core content delivered in holiday periods during year one),
- ✓ If they have a criminal conviction, willing to undertake a DBS check- only the following convictions will prevent someone participating in the programme
 - A criminal offence involving violence against another person.
 - Subject of a public protection sentence.

How to get a place

1. We plan to run information sessions for young people, their carers, social workers and the teams that support them.

If a young person fits the programme eligibility and wants to join they:

1. Complete our online application - this can be done over the phone with one of our team supporting
2. Once they receive an offer, they complete our onboarding process (as this is a paid programme young people will onboarded like all new starters at EY). They will need to fill out some forms, complete a Right to Work Check, provide their bank details and NI number; as well as have permission from a guardian to participate if under 18 years old

FAQs

1. How will the programme be delivered?

The majority of delivery will take place face to face at University of Warwick, Coventry and also the EY Birmingham Office. Additionally, elements of the programme such as group mentoring and bespoke group sessions will take place virtually. Young people will be sent a loan laptop for each delivery phase.

2. What kind of work placement will young people have?

In partnership with University of Warwick, we will aim to create work placements that take into account young people's future ambitions and skills. We cannot guarantee any specific opportunities however, we do commit to all participants having a meaningful work experience, where they will gain insight and transferrable skills.

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
